

The UAE's Global Efforts in Response to the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)

Overview on the UAE Global Efforts:

- The UAE is one of the first countries to reach out and extend a hand of help to combat the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, where it has started early planning of many humanitarian initiatives to help curb the spread of the virus.
- While the UAE continues its constant work of supporting the global efforts aimed at curbing the spread of the COVID-19 disease, it has provided more than 2,250 tons of medical aid, ventilators, testing kits, personal protective kits and supplies to 136 countries worldwide.

2,250 tons of medical supplies, including:

- 4.25 million polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing kits.
- 2,110 ventilators.



136 countries benefited from UAE aid.

80% of the provided international response to the affected countries is from the UAE.



200 number of medical flights.

117 countries received aid from the international organizations' warehouses in Dubai's International Humanitarian City (IHC).



6 mobile hospitals established in Sudan, Guinea-Conakry, Mauritania, Sierra Leone, Lebanon and Jordan.



1 mobile clinic in Turkmenistan

USD **10** million in-kind aid to the WHO.



2 WFP field hospitals transported by the UAE from Norway and Belgium to Ghana and Ethiopia.
